- To extend agreement with MWM Environmental for another 1-year period as proposed, including a percentage increase;

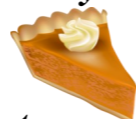

- To make application under the Municipal Economic Development Infrastructure Program for 3 projects (see full minutes for list);
- To approve taxes added and cancelled listing provided by the Provincial Assessment Branch in accordance with Sec 326 and 300 of the Municipal Act;
- To approve change in use taxes added provided by the Provincial Assessment Branch in accordance with Sec 17(5) and 17(7) of the Municipal Assessment Act;
- To request Public Utilities Board authorize Utility deficits of \$23,611 in 2021 and \$64,219 in 2022 to be recovered through transfer from the accumulated cash surplus account (see website for details);
- To adjourn to meet “in-camera” to discuss a financial matter as per Subsections 152(3)(b)(iii) of the Municipal Act;
- To resume back to a regular meeting of council;
- To proceed with drainage reconstruction from 4th to Mill St. to a maximum of \$15,000 using a local contractor whereby expenses be expended from Gas Tax Reserve;
- To adjourn to meet again on Friday October 20, 2023, at 9:00 am in the Council Chambers in Wawanesa.,

Wawanesa Brewers Year in Review

2023 will go down as a very positive year for the Brewers (and was 1 win short of spectacular!). The 16 player team was very similar to last years mix of veterans and young guns with a great core of young local talent! One of the early highlights of the year was the unveiling of the team's new uniforms! The new colour scheme was almost as beautiful as the baseball diamond itself. A huge shout out to Dustin Brown and his crew for taking such good care of the facility. Visiting teams and umpires had many positive comments throughout the year of how great of shape our diamond was in!

The Southwest Baseball League had 9 teams with everyone playing a home and home round robin regular season. The Brewers had a bit of slow start going 2-6 in the first half, but then got things going when it mattered! The team went 6-2 in the second half with their overall 8-8 record being good enough to finish the round robin in fourth place.

The first round of the playoffs was against Virden who finished fifth overall with a 7-8-1 record. Home field advantage turned out to be a key, as after splitting the first two games, the deciding game 3 was held at home. The Brewers won by a score of 17-11 and advanced to the second round of the playoffs!

Round two was a best of 5 game series against the Deloraine Royals who finished third in the regular season. After losing the first game in Deloraine, the Brewers won a very exciting battle in Wawanesa with a walk off victory in the bottom of the 13th inning! The Brewers would then go onto win

the next two games with scores of 7-2 and 2-0. With the series win, the Brewers advanced to the SWBL championship finals for the first time since 2011 and faced the first placed Boissevain Centennials (14-1-1 regular season record).

The best of 5 series was a very exciting time with great crowds and great baseball being played. The Brewers won game one in Boissevain by a score of 4-3 but then lost the next two with scores of 10-5 and 7-4. In a must win game 4 with a huge home crowd, the Brewers came out on top with a 6-5 score, sending the league championship to a final, winner take all game in Boissevain. The Brew Crew fans continued to support the team with many showing up to cheer the team on in person with many others viewing the live stream. Unfortunately the game didn't go our way and we ended up losing 4-1. Although it wasn't the Cinderella ending we were hoping for, the team went much further in the playoffs than they were expected to, and had many people from around the province pulling for the underdogs!

However, the Brewers did win one Championship title this year! We were the Southwest Baseball League representative in Clearwater, MB for the Baseball Manitoba Senior Men's A Championships. The weekend of August 11-13 was right in the middle of the SWBL championship round with Boissevain, so the 4 games in the Provincial weekend added to an already demanding schedule!

The Brewers won their first game of the tournament on Friday, beating the Brandon Cubs 19-8. Saturday saw the Brewers lose to the Carman Cardinals by a score of 10-0. The

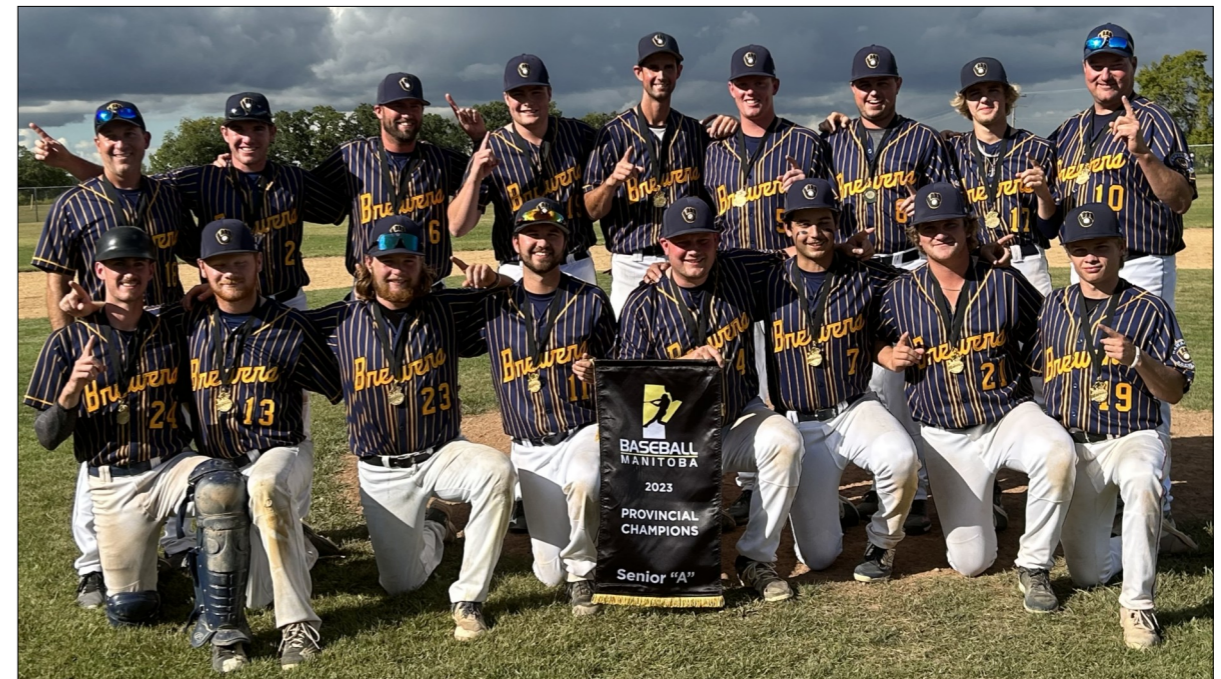
1-1 record put us in second place in our pool set to play the first placed team from the other pool in the semi-final Sunday morning. Clearwater won their 2 round robin pool games but could not compete with the Brewers on Sunday! The Brewers won the semi-final by a score of 12-3 and were set to face the Carman Cardinals once again. The gold medal game was tight and exciting. Carman opened the scoring in the 4th inning by crossing 2 runs over the plate. The Brewers did not give in and would battle back to score 1 in the 5th, 2 in the 6th and 1 in the 7th. After shutting the door in the bottom of the 7th, the Brewers secured the gold medal and championship banner with a final score of 4-2!

2023 was a great season for the Brewers and with playing the 32 games (18-14) that wrapped up August 15, it was one of the longer seasons we've had for many years!

We are very fortunate to have such wonderful fans and support and the coaches and players would like to thank everyone for coming out to the games and all other supportive things you do! It really was a special playoff run with the home crowds being so large and supportive! The players really appreciate the opportunity to be able to play in front of so many great fans. We would also like to acknowledge Loretta Wanless and her team for always having the canteen open for our home games and for the special food occasions! We are fortunate to have this food service available as not many ball parks provide this. We would also very much like to thank our sponsors that help out the team.

Place the bacon on a wire rack on a foil lined baking pan, brush the top of the bacon with maple syrup and sprinkle on some brown sugar.

Bake in a preheated 400F/200C oven for 15 minutes, flip the bacon, brush with maple syrup and sprinkle on the brown sugar and bake for another 15 minutes or until it reaches the desired level of crispiness.

Butternut Squash Soup

2 tablespoons butter
1 medium onion, chopped
1 medium butternut squash (about 4 pounds), peeled and cubed
3 cans (14-1/2 ounces each) vegetable broth
1 tablespoon brown sugar
1 tablespoon minced fresh gingerroot
1 garlic clove, minced
1 cinnamon stick (3 inches)
1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, cubed and softened
Optional: Crystallized ginger and fresh cracked pepper

Directions:

In a small skillet, melt butter over medium heat; add onion. Cook and stir until tender, 3-5 minutes. Transfer to a 5- or 6-quart slow cooker; add squash. Combine broth, brown sugar, ginger, garlic and cinnamon; pour over squash. Cover and cook on low until squash is tender, 6-8 hours. Cool slightly. Discard cinnamon stick. In a blender, process soup in batches until smooth. Return all to slow cooker. Whisk in cream cheese; cover and cook until cheese is melted, about 15 minutes longer. If desired, top with crystallized ginger and fresh cracked pepper.
