



# Obituary



Curt was born December 31st, 1971 in Wawanesa, MB to Marvin and Shirley Gullett. His first name was Fredrick for his two grandfathers.

Curt attended Wawanesa School. He loved sports and being outside. Through high school,

Curt was a farmhand for Jack and Del Mooney, store clerk and meat cutter at Letain's Lucky Dollar, and school assistant custodian. He graduated June 1991, then moved to Brandon and was a sales rep at Reesor's Jewellery.

That fall, Curt met Carla Ewanyshyn of Gilbert Plains, MB, an Education Student attending Brandon University. They were engaged on New Years 1992 then married in Gilbert Plains on June 18th, 1994.

In August 1995, Curt and Carla moved to Cross Lake, MB for Carla's first teaching job. Curt worked at the Northern Store, also enjoying hunting and fishing with good friend Louis Ross. Early in 1996, the Northern Store sent Curt to manage the store in Nelson River. Fall of 1996, he returned to Cross Lake and worked on a construction crew.

Their daughter Julie was born April 1997. In August they moved to Hartney, MB. Curt worked for David and Fay Rolfe at Elgin. But it was joining the Ambulance Service and taking Emergency Medical Responder courses that led Curt to take his Licensed Practical Nursing Certificate at ACC.

Their son Evan was born March 2000. In August 2001, the family moved to Gilbert Plains and in December 2001, Curt graduated with his LPN and began nursing at the Dauphin Hospital in Medicine. In May 2013, Curt

became a Care Team Manager, October 2016 the Director, and January 2021 Manager of Health Services. For a time, Curt travelled from home to Grandview Hospital and then finished his day back at Dauphin Hospital.

Curt coached and managed the kids' hockey and baseball teams and he and the kids became certified hockey refs. The family participated in local Dinner Theatre productions. They fished, camped and travelled with the Ash, Butler, Jubenvill, Tokar and Wilgosh families, just to name a few. Curt loved cooking and baking, gardening, playing host and attending family events, Gullett Christmas in Wawanesa being a favourite. He curled and played Rec Hockey and Slo-pitch. Curt was elected town councillor in October 2006 and in November 2010 became Deputy Mayor. He was a member of the GP Legion and Fire Department and also taught CPR and First Aid, but his passion remained with the ambulance. He became Captain in 2002, eventually stepping down from the leadership role but attended calls right till the service was turned over to PMH November 2018.

Curt absolutely loved being part of Bob and Nancy Tokar's farm operation, their Jon, Ryan (Kristy) and Olivia, like his nephews and niece. Along with his comradery with Murray Stoughton, Curt's dream of farming in retirement was falling into place.

And it was Lyle Smith, a carpenter by trade, and his wife Yvonne who helped Curt and Carla renovate the house on their 20-acre subdivision obtained from Jubenvills.

So after years of planning, Curt and Carla moved to the farm May 2022. Curt and Evan farmed Ev's land at Dutton Siding (formerly Grandpa Peary and Grandma Ellen Shunk's). Then came the animals: chickens, pigs and cows. We will never forget his first bottle-fed calf, Norm...

Life was bumping along nicely... Then at

the end of November 2023, Curt suffered a cardiac event. Fortunately, he was at work at the Dauphin Hospital and received immediate first-rate care then went by air ambulance to St. Boniface in Winnipeg. When Curt returned home, he took a leave from work to recuperate and heal.

The family enjoyed a wonderful Christmas at the farm. Curt and Carla spent days doing chores together, evenings playing cards and games, simply enjoying a taste of what retired life could be. At the end of January, the family flew to Punta Cana, basking in a fabulous vacation in Dominican.

On February 27th during breakfast, Curt collapsed. Paramedics got him to Dauphin, Stars got him to St. Boniface, and there, surrounded by his family, Curt passed away on March 1st.

A Celebration of Life was held on Friday, March 15th from the Gilbert Plains Community Hall. Lead by brother-in-law Kelly Montagnion, those who participated in the service represented the extensive relationships and connections Curt had with family, friends, coworkers, and community members: Norman Long and Dan Meggison (prayers); Karen Wilgosh and Yvonne Smith (scripture readings); GP Legion Members (maple leaf tribute); Chandel Bailey-Morrison and Carla Garton (colleagues); Dave Butler and Dave Pulock (fellow hockey refs); Clint and Carmel Cullen (Best Man and school friends); Bob and Nancy Tokar (farm family); and Dennis Gullett (brother).

Reflections were also shared by Carla, Julie and Evan. Special songs chosen were: Standing Room Only (Tim McGraw), A Good Man (Emerson Drive), and When I Get Where I'm Going (Brad Paisley). The urn bearer was Murray Stoughton.

Private family interment took place in the Elden Cemetery with Pastor Jarrod Clur presiding.

Lunch followed with a few special touches: donuts, pies, and a candy table.

Curt is lovingly remembered by his wife Carla of nearly 30 years; his daughter Julie, son-in-law Wes and granddaughter Paige Meggison of Goodlands, MB; his son Evan and daughter-in-law Gracie Gullett of Gilbert Plains, MB.

Curt also leaves to mourn, his father Marvin Gullett (Deb) of Red Deer, AB: sister Terresa Cullen (Brent) of Brandon, MB; brother Brent Gullett (Tracy) of Stonewall, MB: brother Dennis Gullett (Tanva) of Wawanesa, MB: brother Mike Gullett (Trina) of Red Deer, AB; sister Hayley Giesbrecht (Jeff) of Delburne, AB; mother-in-law Barbara Ewanyshyn of Gilbert Plains, MB; brother-in-law Kevin Ewanyshyn (Liz) of Winnipeg, MB; sister-in-law Melanie Montagnion (Kelly) of Gilbert Plains, MB; nieces and nephews (Ryan & Becky, Ava, Olivia, Alexis, Kori-Anne, Ryley, Rene, Lily, Alex, Grace, Tyson, Ryder, and Jordyn & Matthew) as well as great nieces and a nephew (Calli, Oliver, Chase, and Zoey).

Curt was predeceased by his mother Shirley Gullett and nephew Orey Powers, both of Wawanesa, MB and his father-in-law Bill Ewanyshyn of Gilbert Plains. His beloved dog Marlee still wanders the yard looking for him...

Information was distributed detailing our Community Foundation Scholarship/Granting activity for 2023. (See Separate article below for Grant Activity in 2023).

We were delighted to have Dean Boyd, one of the original Board members who assisted Mick in establishing the Community Foundation back in 1993, recount the early days of the Foundation and the wonderful support from our community. Dean was Chair of the Community Foundation Board for a good number of those early years!!

From modest beginnings the Wawanesa Community Foundation Inc. now manages total assets of \$670,000 for our year end 2022. Recent major grants were made to the Reno the Rink project with \$30,000 over three years. Our Foundation in recent years also purchased the mini-boards at the arena – our first solo community project, and in 2021 we were proud to distribute over \$100,000 back to the community assisting in the Covid relief programs.

#### MARGUERITE CORY COMMUNITY VOLUNTEERISM AWARD

The Marguerite Cory Community Volunteerism Award is presented annually recognizing outstanding contributions to our community. Marguerite, who passed away in late 2018, was a tireless and dedicated volunteer in many aspects of our Oakland-Wawanesa com-

munity, uniting rural and village in many common community causes. Marguerite Cory exemplified the selfless community giving which the spirit of this award recognizes.

#### **ENES MUHELJIC NOMINATION**

September 5 1995 was an important day for the town of Wawanesa. That was the day that Enes Muheljic, his wife Fata and children Edvina and Sebira arrived to begin their new lives in Manitoba. As refugees from the war in the Balkans, they arrived with limited possessions and very little English, but possessed an abundance of energy and a spirit to make the best life for their family.

It would be undoubtedly admirable if the Muheljics simply went forth and created a prosperous and rewarding life for themselves which they certainly have done, but they have done much more than that as they have given back to the community that welcomed them in.

Enes soon joined the volunteer ambulance and fire services, mastering the training courses taught in his second language. Taking 360 hours of training, in his second language, Enes attained his level one and two firefighting training as well as becoming an EMT (Emergency Medical Technician). With this training he became one of the most active firefighters and EMT in the community all while carving out a new life in a new town in a new country. Meanwhile, Fata worked diligently cleaning at the hospital, church and other public places.

Besides his fire and EMT service Enes also has left a legacy of his masonry skills for community projects like the old school cairn, the Sipiweske museum, stone pillars for the Wawanesa sign and more recently the benches he has built to honour his dear Fata who was taken from Enes and the rest of the community far too early. The lookout benches have

quickly become a favourite spot for residents and tourists alike! When Marguerite Cory became incapacitated with ALS, Enes and Fata provided many meals and so much support to Marguerite and the family at such a difficult time.

The Board Chair added to this nomination: Nothing makes me prouder than coming down the curve into town and the first thing a visitor would see is a very beautiful home proudly flying the Canadian flag in both the front and backyard!! I love that feeling and sight as we come back home to our little community.

Through his fire and EMT work Enes took care of his community when they were in the greatest need. His professional development in the area allowed ambulance services to continue as long as possible. They are the

best of us.

Shaun and Gene Cory were on hand to help present the 2023 Marguerite Cory Volunteerism Award to recognize Enes and Fata Muheljic.

Thank you to Shaun/Gene and thank you to the Muheljic family. Volunteers in our Community continue to play a vital part in ensuring our community remains vibrant. We are so fortunate to have so many committed people working very hard, often out of the limelight, to get things done for the betterment of our community.

On behalf of the Board, Chair Glenn McGregor expressed appreciation for the fantastic community support our Wawanesa Community Foundation receives and invited all to enjoy the Santa Claus parade immediately following the BBQ!
